News from the Field

California: *The Washington Post* has a <u>video</u>, "**California Needs to Burn**. Native Women Are Leading the Way," filmed at the **Klamath Women-in-Fire TREX** this fall. You can see photos of a lot more good burning in the state on the <u>TREX Facebook page</u>.

California: The U.S. Forest Service recently <u>announced</u> that it has signed 11 new agreements to advance **tribal co-stewardship of national forests**. Among these is a supplement to a Master Stewardship Agreement with the **Karuk Tribe** and other partners for the **Western Klamath Restoration Partnership Planning Area**. "This year's agreement will address fuels reduction and forest health through collaboration and project monitoring, including strategic wildfire control features, **integrated landscape-scale fuels reduction**, and **restorative prescribed fire treatments** in the tribal community of Orleans."

Minnesota: An issue of the U.S. Forest Service newsletter *The Cross-Pollinator*—"<u>Learning from the</u> <u>Ojibwe</u>: **Combining Culture and Dendrochronology** Tools"—highlights a **research partnership** on Windigoominis (Star Island). The partnership includes the **Leech Lake Band of Ojibwe**, **Leech Lake Tribal College**, **University of Minnesota** and the **Chippewa National Forest**.

Oregon: **Ember Alliance** fire management officer **Jennifer Mueller** (<u>iennifer@emberalliance.org</u>) speaks of the power of a special place in her <u>post</u> "**Cultural Burning and Learning**," about using fire at **Sycan Marsh**.

Funding: JFSP

JFSP: The Joint Fire Science Program research funding opportunities for fiscal year 2023 are open through **December 20**. Research areas this year include topics around effectiveness and longevity of fuel treatments, pre-fire actions to reduce post-fire hazards, and social and political factors that affect costs. Input Requested: Wildfire Commission

Wildfire Commission: The federal **Wildland Fire Mitigation and Management Commission** has held its first couple of meetings, and several workgroups have begun discussing several topics. Other workgroups will take up the remainder of the topics over the next few months. You can currently **submit recommendations** <u>via a web form</u> to the groups working on **landscapes** or **communities** (both close today) or **post-fire issues** (closes January 6). (All topics, and when recommendations will be accepted for each, are also on that page.)

Zoom Accessibility: Learn how to enable automatic **closed captions**, **spotlight speakers**, and a few other features in the <u>brief video</u> "Zoom Accessible Features Overview."

FAC Roles: Through interviews with a variety of community members, the <u>video</u> "**Many Roles with a Common Goal**" from **Fire Adapted New Mexico Learning Network** helps practitioners and residents see their place in the preparedness picture.

Social Science: Last week's **FAC Net** <u>blog post</u>, "The Value of a Listening Ear and an Inquiring Mind: The Career of **Dr. Sarah McCaffrey**," collects some **highlights from the wide-ranging work** of the newly retired researcher, each flagged with "what we loved."

Articles & Reports: Smoke / Drought / Risk / Indigenous Fire Management

Smoke: The authors of the <u>article</u> "Comparing Smoke **Emissions and Impacts** Under Alternative Forest Management Regimes" explored **five management options** through modeling, using the Lake Tahoe Basin as a case study.

Drought: The <u>article</u> "Tree Mortality Response to **Drought-Density Interactions** Suggests Opportunities to **Enhance Drought Resistance**" is based on measurements of more than 28,000 ponderosa pine trees over nearly two decades.

Risk: The <u>article</u> "The U.S. Forest Service Life First Safety Initiative: Exploring **Unnecessary Exposure to Risk**" is based on a survey of more than 2,600 employees. "Survey respondents described **four main situations** in which wildland firefighters commonly accepted unnecessary exposure to risk, related to **driving, mop up, aviation and communication**."

Indigenous Fire Management: The authors of the <u>paper</u> "Indigenous Fire Management and Cross-Scale **Fire-Climate Relationships** in the Southwest United States from 1500 to 1900 CE" conclude that "Restoring or emulating Indigenous fire practices **could buffer climate impacts at local scales** but would need to be repeatedly implemented at broad scales for broader regional benefits." An <u>article</u> in *Axios* captures highlights of the paper.

In the News: Traditional Ecological Knowledge / DoD-NWCG

Traditional Ecological Knowledge: For the first time, the **federal government** has <u>issued guidance</u> to agencies regarding **recognizing and including Indigenous knowledge** in research, policy and decision making.

DoD-NWCG: This month the **Department of Defense**, which manages 27 million acres of training and testing lands, became a **primary member** of the **National Wildfire Coordinating Group** (<u>NWCG</u>).

Jobs

Fire & Fuels: The **U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service** has posted two **forestry technician** (prescribed fire/ fuel technician) positions, as Air Force fire support, in Florida and Louisiana. Details are on usajobs.gov (control number 692317400); applications are due by **December 14**.

Rx Module: The Ember Alliance is filling **five positions** for a **prescribed fire module** to be based on the Uwharrie NF (**North Carolina**). The permanent positions will be nearly year-long, with possibility of extension dependent on funding; seasonal positions will be five to six months. All positions include **benefits and housing**. The Bear Jaw Fire and Fuels Crew is accepting applications to establish an eligibility list for the position of Seasonal Fire & Fuels Technician. A Fire & Fuels Technician will perform duties related to hazardous fuels reduction, fire prevention, public education, prescribed/pile burns, fire suppression, and other activities that support the protection of life and property. This position is scheduled to work 40 hour work weeks, and normally runs seasonally from April through October. Employment may require individuals to be away from home or out of the state for extended periods of time. Previous history as a team player, laborer, mechanic, machinist, framer, welder, and other skillful trades are utilized outside the crews normal fire and fuels tasks. Ability for applicants to push themselves mentally and physically is a requirement.
