News from the Field

California: The PBS NOVA <u>documentary</u> **"Weathering the Future**" that aired last week visited the Klamath Mountains to hear from **Indigenous voices** and watch a **Karuk-led burn**.

Maryland: Deborah Landau (<u>dlandau@tnc.org</u>) talks fire—and WTREX—on a <u>recent episode</u> of the Good Together **podcast**, "Not All Wildfires Are Bad: How **Controlled Burns Can Be Medicine** for the Land."

Minnesota: In the <u>FAC Net blog post</u> "Who's Your Hero? **Finding Community Leaders** in Fire-Adapted Northeastern Minnesota," **Gloria Erickson** (<u>gloria@dovetailinc.org</u>) and some of those community leaders write about **coming together to reduce wildfire risk** across four neighboring properties. In the end, they're building more than fire resilience.

Missouri: The first Southern Missouri Prescribed Fire Training Exchange was a success, by any measure you choose. The **30 participants** served in **at least two positions each**; most had open task books and **received evaluations**, and several received a final evaluation, only awaiting agency certification. Together they assisted on **17 burns**—on lands owned by the Boy Scouts of America, Missouri Department of Conservation, Missouri DNR, The Nature Conservancy and U.S. Forest Service—totaling **15,868 acres**. Classroom and hands-on **training opportunities** ran the gamut from pump and roll techniques to emotional intelligence on the fireline, burn plan writing to chainsaw use. North Carolina: With a burn last week in mixed pine oak heath and dry oak forest in the Central Blue Ridge Escarpment landscape of the Southern Blue Ridge FLN, the TNC-NC Southern Blue Ridge Fire Crew set a new record for acres burned in a season—21,610 acres, in support of seven state and federal agencies. The Steels Creek burn was conducted to reduce decades of accumulation of volatile shrubs and dead wood that put the Gingercake community at risk for wildfire, and to open the area to sunlight for pine and oak seedlings and a diverse plant community that will provide foraging habitat for pollinators and grassland songbirds. North Carolina/Tennessee: The Forest Service has <u>awarded</u> Collaborative Forest Landscape Restoration Program (CFLRP) funding to the Pisgah Restoration Initiative to promote more resilient forests across 520,000 acres in the Pisgah National Forest in western North Carolina and 30,000 acres of the Cherokee National Forest in eastern Tennessee. Key collaborators on this project—which builds on the success of the Grandfather CFLRP project—include the North Carolina Wildlife Resources Commission, The Nature Conservancy in North Carolina and the Appalachian Trail Conservancy. Funding & Support: Smoke Preparedness / National Forest Foundation / CWPP Assistance

Smoke Preparedness: The EPA's Wildfire Smoke Preparedness in Community Buildings grant program is open to states, tribes, public pre-schools, local educational agencies and non-profit organizations. EPA anticipates awarding approximately 13-18 grants, ranging from \$100,000 to \$2,000,000. Details are on the EPA website; applications are due by May 9.

National Forest Foundation: NFF has made **changes** to its flagship **Matching Awards Program**, and now "focuses primarily on **in-person community engagement** and completion of appropriate stewardship activities." See details on <u>nationalforests.org</u>; key dates are an informational webinar on **April 25** and an application deadline of **June 7**.

CWPP Assistance: The **International Association of Fire Chiefs** is accepting applications from **fire departments** and partnering agencies in **high-risk communities** for its Community Wildfire Protection Plan Assistance Program. Six departments will be selected to receive **assistance from subject matter experts**, and may receive funding for a community engagement day. Input Requested: Rx Training / TREX

Rx Training: **The Ember Alliance**—with support from the **FLN**—is conducting a **survey** about **prescribed fire training needs** across the **western U.S.** to help identify prescribed fire training needs, and inform recommendations on the training opportunities (both NWCG and non-NWCG) needed **build capacity** for getting more prescribed fire on the ground. All practitioners and stakeholders in the region are invited to <u>take the survey</u> by **April 28**.

TREX: If you have **taken part in one of the 130 TREX** held between 2008 and 2022 (including WTREX or the Loess Hills CBW), you **should have received a survey request** last week from **Jeremy Bailey**. Resources: Messaging / First Aid / RT-130

Messaging: Last fall members of the Greater Yellowstone Fire Action Network met to work on creating consistent messaging about fire for a range of themes and audiences. In last week's FAC Net <u>blog post</u>, "Tips for Creating Consistent Messaging About Fire," Liz Davy (<u>lizdavy88@gmail.com</u>) shares some of their learning.

First Aid: The "NWCG **Standards for Wildland Fire First Aid**" (<u>PMS 560</u>) are intended "to support first aid training appropriate for the **remote working environment** and first aid **skills specific to the occupational and operational needs** of wildland firefighters."

RT-130: For those planning a **Wildland Fire Safety Training Annual Refresher** course, **NWCG** has a <u>collection of resources</u> on a range of topics that can be used to **build an agenda**. Modules include details on estimated delivery time, intent, facilitator preparation, and discussion questions.

Articles & Reports: Managed Wildfire / Firewood Piles / Fuel Treatments

Managed Wildfire: "Managed Wildfire: A Research **Synthesis and Overview**" was released this month by the Forest Stewards Guild, Ecological Restoration Institute and Southwest Fire Science Consortium. The <u>report</u> covers history, effects, current state and future of **managing wildfire for resource benefit**. **Firewood Piles**: The <u>technical report</u> **"Wind-Driven Fire Spread** to a Structure From Firewood Piles" supports the common **defensible space recommendation** to keep firewood stacks away from structures—and perhaps extends it: "In long range experiments, firebrands from a woodpile caused ignitions over 26 m (85 ft) downwind."

Fuel Treatments: A <u>research team</u> at Colorado State University has released the <u>report</u> "Assessing How **Fuel Treatments Are Considered During Incident Response**." The work is based on **interviews** with fire and fuel personnel and **case studies** of seven wildfires in the **western U.S.** where existing fuel treatments were considered in incident response. Key findings and recommendations are included in a two-page <u>research brief</u>.

In the News: PM 2.5

PM 2.5: In the wake of the **proposed EPA rule change** for fine particulate matter, air quality and the **role of prescribed fire and wildfire** are in the news. KQED has a good overview in the <u>article</u> "Here's Why Wildfire Experts Are Worried About an EPA Plan for Cleaner Air." And in a Twitter <u>thread</u>, Michael Wara (Stanford) teases out some detail laid out by his team of students, legal fellows and postdocs.
