

Randy Swaty joined The Nature Conservancy's Michigan Chapter in 2002 as a Forest Ecologist tasked with working with a variety of owners of large landscapes to promote sustainable management practices and leading the LANDFIRE Rapid Assessment effort in the Lake States region. His scientific specialties cover spatial scales ranging from community genetics to mycorrhizal ecology and landscape-scale planning.



Randy joined LANDFIRE full time in 2007 and has covered a variety of bases, including working to improve forest certification standards, participating in Conservation Area Planning, serving on the Conservancy's Forest Management SOP team, and contributing to the Global Fire Assessment. He develops vegetation models and applies LANDFIRE products within and outside of the Conservancy. He facilitates workshops and seminars on the use of LANDFIRE data and products and is one of the leaders of the Biophysical Settings Review project.

Randy grew up in Little Rock and earned both Bachelor and Masters degrees at Northern Arizona University in Flagstaff. He splits his time between Marquette, MI and Evanston, IL.
