News from the Field

Arkansas: More than 50 partners in the Ozark Ouachita Highlands Collaborative and Shortleaf Pine-Bluestem Community and Ozark Highlands CFLRP projects met last week. Partners shared updates and outlooks at a sit-down meeting, followed the next day by a field tour of the Gulf Mountain WMA chemical treatment and fire have been applied in grasslands and woodlands, and growing season fire in oak and pine-oak woodland. Georgia: Georgia Blue Ridge Mountains landscape partners held their first face-to-face winter workshop in three years. Gathered at Unicoi State Park in Helen, Georgia, partners shared their 2023 prescribed fire plans and special projects, and received an update on local and regional FAC Net efforts. In the afternoon, they traveled to nearby Smithgall Woods State Park to see the results of 2022 prescribed fire operations. One participant, recently arrived from Oregon, stated "I am so impressed at how you're all working together to accomplish your prescribed fire goals." Georgia: The Nature Conservancy's Southern Blue Ridge Prescribed Fire Module begins its eighth season this spring. This year's five-person crew will continue its all-lands approach with SBR FLN partners in the Georgia Blue Ridge Mountains landscape and on the Andrew Pickens Ranger District in South Carolina. Since 2016, these crews have participated in nearly 57,000 acres of fuels treatments, and they are a valued asset for FLN partners. For more, contact Erick Brown (erick.brown@tnc.org).

New Mexico: The Forest Stewards Guild has opened the public conversation about returning prescribed fire to the state, after last year's Calf Canyon/Hermit's Peak Fire was started by a prescribed burn. In stories in the <u>Albuquerque Journal</u> and TV station <u>KOB4</u>, Sam Berry (sam@forestguild.org) and Eytan Krasilovsky (eytan@forestguild.org) talked about the additional precautions the Guild will take when it begins burning again.

Last week, they got the necessary snow cover and **conducted their first pile burning**, at Glorieta Camps; see the article and video from the *Albuquerque Journal*.

Input Requested: Wildfire Commission / First Aid Curriculum

Wildfire Commission: The federal Wildland Fire Mitigation and Management Commission has held its first couple of meetings, and several workgroups have begun discussing several topics. Other workgroups will take up the remainder of the topics over the next few months. Beginning February 1 you can submit recommendations via a web form to the groups working on science, data and technology and public health and infrastructure. (All topics, and when recommendations will be accepted for each, are also on that page.)

First Aid Curriculum: A public health graduate student from the **University of Colorado** is inviting wildland fire practitioners to take part in a **survey to inform first aid training**. See the attached note for details and to schedule an interview.

Resources: Air Filtration / Burns / Workshops

Air Filtration: The <u>article</u> "Efficacy of Do-It-Yourself Air Filtration Units in Reducing Exposure to Simulated Respiratory Aerosols" looks at aerosols in the context of COVID mitigation, but measured particles in the **0.3–3 µm** range. It includes specifications for the DIY units tested.

Burns: The **NWCG** Emergency Medical Committee has released new **burn protocols**, which <u>include</u> a **decision tree** for medical response and **guidelines for medical providers** that are specific to firefighters.

Workshops: Keegan Fengler shared lessons learned from hosting the 2022 Washington Fire Adapted Communities Learning Network annual workshop in the FAC Net blog post "Designing a FAC Workshop for Engagement, Connection and Reflection."

Articles & Reports: WUI / Thinning Cost / Trauma & Cognition / Non-Forest Fires

WUI: The <u>article</u> "An Expanded Framework for Wildland–Urban Interfaces and Their Management" looks at WUI as far more than as an area of wildfire risk. Rather, it is conceptualized as a coupled social-ecological system, that is vertically structured from bedrock to the tops of vegetation, with landscape heterogeneity and complex connections. Together, these influence hazards, ecosystem services and conservation.

Thinning Cost: A research team from the Ecological Restoration Institute (ERI), Rocky Mountain Research Station and Kangwon National University (South Korea) systematically **selected and reviewed 20 thinning studies** published over the from 1980 to 2020 and analyzed key variables affecting **machine productivity and harvesting costs**. Results are in an <u>article</u> in the *Journal of Forestry*, with highlights captured in an ERI <u>fact sheet</u>.

Trauma & Cognition: The <u>article</u> "Differences in Interference Processing and Frontal Brain Function With Climate Trauma From California's Deadliest Wildfire" was based on a sample of 48 people directly or indirectly impacted by the **Camp Fire**. For a summary, see the <u>news release</u> "Californian **Wildfire Trauma** Associated With **Cognitive Deficits and Altered Brain Activity**."

Non-Forest Fires: The <u>article</u> "Rethinking the Focus on Forest Fires in Federal Wildland Fire Management: Landscape Patterns and Trends of Non-Forest and Forest Burned Area" explores a variety of patterns and trends in **forested vs. non-forested** lands managed by **different agencies**.

Message from Matthew Schilz (MPH Student, Colorado School of Public Health):
