



Training Opportunity

Flagstaff Fire Department & Summit Fire and Medical District Prescribed Fire Training Exchange (TRES)

Oct 18th – Nov 1st, 2021 based in Flagstaff, Arizona (Tentative Dates)

Objectives: To increase fire department capacity to plan and implement good fire projects in the wildland urban interface and to mitigate unwanted fire effects to local communities.

Target Group: A diverse applicant pool of prescribed fire and wildfire personnel from city, county and other local agencies and departments is desired; all agency and non-governmental organization fire personnel are welcome.

Registration Fee: The fee is \$300. Fees may be waived for participants who bring equipment (e.g. engines, UTVs, etc.)

Description: Participants will serve in NWCG qualified and trainee positions and will assist with preparing, scouting, briefing, igniting, holding, mop-up, and patrol on controlled burns in the area. There will be opportunities for pre- and post-fire monitoring, training with equipment, and practice of fire line leadership skills. Participants will also learn about local fire ecology and fire management practices and techniques.

Scholarships may be available for Fire Department and District applicants through the International Association of Fire Chiefs Ready, Set, Go! Program.

Applications are due by July 16th, 2021. Space is limited and selections will be made by Friday, August 20th, 2021.

Requirements: Participants must:

1. Be able to work as a member of a team, in an outdoor environment, under any-and-all conditions.
2. As a minimum, be **current and qualified NWCG-FFT2**, or have **completed NWCG courses S-130, S-190, L-180, and FEMA courses IS-100, 200 & 700**, to include completion of an **arduous pack test** within the 12 months prior to the TRES event.
3. Demonstrate/attest to having health **insurance, to include Workers Comp coverage.**
4. Bring all necessary PPE, to include **fire-approved boots** (all leather, 8-inches tall, Vibram soles, with no steel toe), Fire Shelter, Hard Hat, Nomex Clothing, Leather Gloves, Neck & Face Shroud, Eye Protection, Line Pack, Canteens, etc.

Meals & Travel: Meals will be provided. Lodging may be provided, but participants should bring their own tents, pads and sleeping bags. Bathrooms, showers and indoor meeting space with internet will be available.
